

Introduction to Asunaro Junior High School

Asunaro Junior High School will open in April 2025.

We aim to be a school where students, regardless of age, nationality, or occupation, respect and recognize each other, where they can learn with confidence and challenge themselves with ambition to realize their hopes and dreams.

Let's cooperate and learn how to overcome difficulties.


Outline of Study

Content the same as daytime junior high school:

- Students study the same subjects as in daytime middle school.
- Taught by licensed teachers.
- There will be field trips, ball games, and exchanges with other schools.
- Upon graduation from the school, students can obtain a junior high school diploma, awarded at a graduation ceremony.
- You cannot learn only specific subjects or just Japanese as a language.

Content different from daytime junior high school:

- Curriculum differs from that of daytime junior high schools in terms of the number of class hours, etc.
- In principle, students graduate in three years. Based on the student's wishes and learning situation, it is possible to start from the second or third grade. Students can also attend longer than 3 years.





Class days and study hours

- Students attend school 5 days a week from Monday to Friday.
- Each class lasts 40 minutes. The four classes run from approximately 5:30 p.m. to 9:00 p.m.
- There are summer and winter breaks, the length of which is the same as that of daytime junior high school.

- In order to meet the various needs of students, we offer four courses: three courses based on proficiency level and one course that focuses on the acquisition of Japanese language skills necessary for class comprehension.
- · Some elementary school content may be covered.
- Courses that focus on Japanese language acquisition include approximately 8 hours of Japanese language classes per week.

Cost

- Since it is a public junior high school, tuition is not required. Textbooks are provided free of charge.
- There is a fee for certain materials used in class.
 Transportation fees may also be required for events, etc.
